In the mid-1920s, while a court in Tennessee was debating the teaching of Darwinian evolution versus Biblical creationism, on the other side of the world a Belgian Roman Catholic priest named Georges Lemaître was teaching physics and astronomy at Université Catholique de Louvain. Father Lemaître had studied astronomy and cosmology at the University of Cambridge as well as the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Working from Einstein's general theory of relativity, in 1927 he published a paper proposing that the universe is expanding. One consequence of this expanding universe theory is that the universe at one time must have been significantly smaller, denser, and hotter. Working both from mathematics and astronomical observation, Father Lemaître proposed a model for understanding the origin of the universe that was not initially accepted by Einstein.

When English astronomer Edwin Hubble produced a paper supporting Lemaître's work, however, Einstein quickly endorsed the idea.

This model for origin of the universe was first derisively called the Big Bang. Today, that cosmological model-- and even that name-- are universally accepted by scientists. Father Lemaître died in 1966, shortly after the discovery of cosmic microwave background radiation that verified his theories about the origins of the universe.

Because the Catholic tradition doesn't interpret the Bible literally, Catholic scholars and scientists are free to explore God's creation and to study the intricacies of the universe. Belgian Father Georges Lemaître is a shining example of the integration of scientific research and religious faith.
