This coming week I'll be in Washington, DC, for the annual Paulist Fathers Pastors, Directors, and Superiors meeting. We gather each fall to catch up on community news, look at how we're implementing the mandates of last summer's General Assembly, and reflect on our mission cross the US.

These are important meetings, and I hope you will keep us in your prayers this week. As a member of a religious order (technically, a "society of apostolic life"), my life until last year has been framed by living and working with my Paulist brothers. My situation at RPI— living alone and serving as the only Paulist here— is a bit anomalous, but not unheard-of in the Paulist community. I'm very happy with my ministry and my life here, but I also need to be intentional about staying connected to my community.

Next weekend marks an important milestone for the Paulists. We will be dedicating Hecker House, the Paulist house of mission and studies in Washington DC. A few years ago, we sold our large seminary property and building, and began the process of constructing a house of formation and ministry that was more appropriately sized. The new building is really beautiful as well as functional. In addition to the expected facilities (chapel, bedrooms, common space, etc.) it will also house a state-of-the-art digital media production studio. This is very much in keeping with the Paulists engagement with communications technologies. I won't be able to stay for the dedication of the new building. I'll be back in Troy for our weekend liturgies.

Over the next few months, you'll get to meet more of my Paulist brothers. Some of them have graciously offered to cover for me occasionally, so that I might be able to spend a little time with my family in Syracuse and Rochester. They're good men, and I know you'll enjoy getting to know them.
