On November 11th, the Church celebrates the feast of St. Martin of Tours, a bishop in France in the late fourth century. As the first saint added to the calendar of the Western Church who was not a martyr, Martin is remembered as the founder of the first monastery in the West. On his feast day, it is traditional to celebrate with a feast of roast goose, which may make the observance a predecessor to our contemporary celebration of Thanksgiving.

One legend about St. Martin claims that the bishop, annoyed by a goose, ordered it killed and served for dinner. After dining on the goose, so the story goes, Martin died, and so a goose is served each year on his feast day.

Another story explaining the tradition says that Martin ran and hid in a barn, so that the Church authorities couldn't locate him to make him bishop. He was given away, so this story goes, by the honking of the geese, and became one of the greatest leaders of the Church in his time.

A less fanciful explanation for the traditional roast goose on the Feast of St. Martin, is simply that geese are plentiful at this time of year and are an obvious choice for a meal celebrating the completion of the harvest.

Whatever the origin of the tradition, it serves to illustrate the intimate connection between our faith, and the natural cycle of feasts and seasons. Sometimes those connections are pretty obvious, with now-secular holidays like Halloween and Valentine's Day, others, like St. Martin and the geese, have taken on the characteristics of fanciful legends. But our faith calls us to make time itself sacred, by marking the passing days and seasons in ways that remind us of God's blessings found in the bounty of the harvest, and the lives of holy men and women.
