# FR. LARRY RICE, CSP

Because the church has, for centuries, promoted higher education, it shouldn't be a surprise that many famous scientists and researchers were Catholic priests. Perhaps one of the best-known is Augustinian father Gregor Mendel. Born in the year 1822, Mendel entered the Augustinian abbey of St. Thomas in Brno in 1843. Seven years later, he was sent to the University of Vienna to study and return to the Abbey two years later to teach physics.

Encouraged by his university professors and his brothers at the monastery, Mendel began to study variations in plants, using the monasteries garden as his laboratory. Between 1856 in 1863 he cultivated and analyzed some 29,000 pea plants. By studying traits that were passed between generations of plants, Mendel determined that one in four pea plants had purebred recessive traits, two out of four possessed hybrid traits, and one out of four showed pure bred dominant traits. From this research came to conclusions which were later known as Mendel's Laws of Inheritance.

Although like the people of his time Fr. Mendel did not understand the mechanism of genetic inheritance, since DNA was discovered nearly 100 years later, he is nevertheless known as the father of modern genetics.

In 1868 Mendel was made abbot of the Abbey of St. Thomas in Brno. Faced with the additional responsibilities administration of running a large abbey, his scientific research came to an end. He died in 1884, at age 61, and well-known Czech composer Leos Janacek played the organ at his funeral.

Mendel's work on genetics was not widely accepted until after his death. Still, his painstaking research and careful analysis forms the foundation of our modern understanding of the functioning of genetics.

The fact that a priest could carry out such research illustrates the connections between scientific analysis of the created world, and a deep love for the God who created it.
