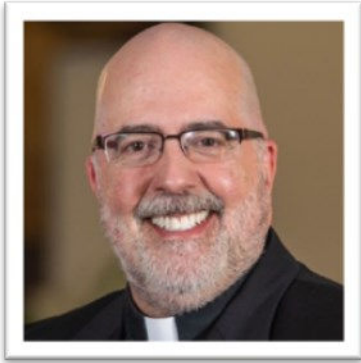

Over the past 500 years the Church has seen many priest/scientists: Copernicus, Mendel, Lemaitre, and many others less well known. But few have been as complex as Pierre Teilhard de Chardin.

Born in France in 1881, Teilhard was a Jesuit priest, a philosopher, as well as a paleontologist and geologist. In the first decade of the 20th century, he worked in Paris at the French National Museum of Natural History, and in 1923 traveled to China with Jesuit Father Emile Licent, who was collecting scientific observations from Christian missionaries there. In 1926 he worked with the expedition that researched the origins of the protohuman "Peking Man."

Teilhard is best known, however, for his philosophical synthesis of evolutionary science. His primary work, "The Phenomenon of Man," moved away from a strict interpretation of the Book of Genesis, and toward a sweeping account of the unfolding of the cosmos, and the ultimate culmination of all creation, the so-called Omega Point. As creation increases in complexity and deeper consciousness, he believed, God draws all things to himself.

Teilhard's writings were not without their critics and detractors. He was criticized for controversial statements regarding the doctrine of original sin, and in 1962 the Holy Office-- now the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith-- issued a warning denouncing his work. Nevertheless, his writings have been influential in 20th century theology, and he remains an example of how theology and the physical sciences can work together to deepen our understanding of God's creation.

After his death, Fr. Teilhard was interred in the cemetery of the Jesuit novitiate in Hyde Park NY. That facility is now the home of the Culinary Institute of America. Should you find yourself in Hyde Park or enjoying a meal at the CIA, you can still visit his grave.
