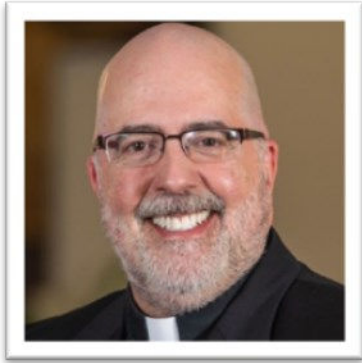

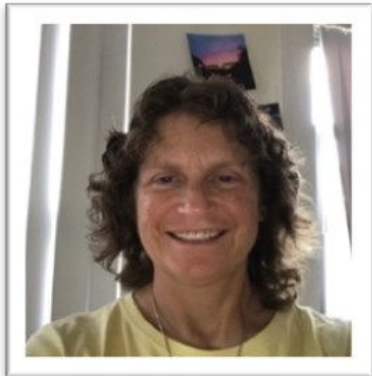

When asked about a saint who served the lepers of Hawaii, most people would probably mention Damien De Veuster, or Damien of Molokai. But another American religious sister who worked with Damien is on the path to sainthood: St. Marianne Cope. Although more people seem to recognize St. Kateri Tekakwitha, St. Marianne also has roots in upstate New York.

Born Maria Anna Barbara Koob in 1838, she was the daughter of German immigrants who settled in Utica, NY. At the age of 24, following her father's death, she entered the Third Order Franciscan sisters. Sr. Marianne worked for 10 years as a teacher, and also helped found the first two Catholic hospitals in the US in the 1860s. In 1883, after becoming Mother Provincial, she traveled from Syracuse to Honolulu, answering a plea from Hawaiian King David Kalākaua to provide nursing care to those suffering from Hansen's Disease-- leprosy.

Mother Marianne worked for five years on O'ahu, managing a hospital that received patients from all over the islands, sending the most serious cases to quarantine settlements on the island of Moloka'i. As Fr. Damien's health began to fail in 1888, She moved to the leper colony at Kalaupapa on Molokai, and with two other assistants established a school for girls. After Damien's death, Marianne assumed care of the boys school as well.

Working in the leper colony for 20 years, Mother Marianne never contracted Hansen's disease, unlike Fr. Damien, who succumbed to it in 1889. In 2005 Mother Marianne Cope was declared Blessed by pope Benedict XVI and was canonized by him on October 21, 2012. Her feast day is January 23rd, and she's the patron saint of outcasts and people with HIV/AIDS.
