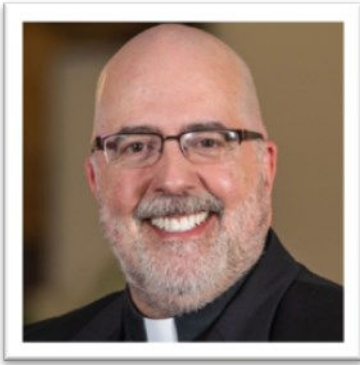

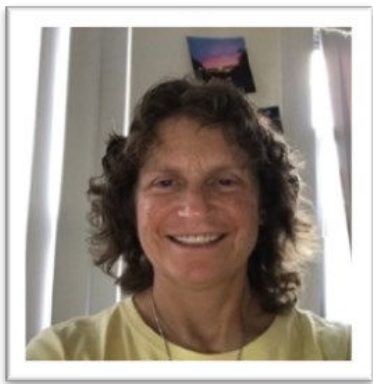
Most people, when they hear that the Holy See has a penitentiary, probably depict some sort of dungeon beneath the Vatican, where the most heinous sinners are imprisoned, probably for some nefarious purpose. But the truth is that the Apostolic Penitentiary is a centuries-old tribunal of the Holy See, whose primary purpose isn't punishment but mercy.

The Apostolic Penitentiary handles the absolution of excommunications that are reserved to the Holy See, which includes desecration of the Eucharist, and priests who have broken the seal of confession. In addition, the Penitentiary grants dispensations for those sacramental impediments reserved to the Holy See, and also handles the issuance and governance of indulgences.

Today the Apostolic Penitentiary's work on absolution of excommunications is handled in the "internal forum", meaning that the case and all its consequences are kept confidential. Even the petitions for forgiveness are submitted with pseudonyms, so that the tribunal itself doesn't know the identities of the people involved.

The indulgences published by the Apostolic Penitentiary are the partial or total lifting of the punishment due to sin. Those that are permanently available to the faithful are published in the Vatican's Encheridion Indulgentiarum.

The head of this Vatican tribunal is called the Major Penitentiary, and is one of the very few offices of the Holy See that retains his position when the papacy is vacant between the death of a pope and the election of a new one. Since September 2013, the Major Penitentiary has been Cardinal Mauro Piacenza.
