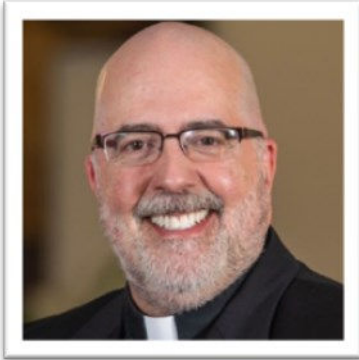

It is widely known that the Catholic Church, like many Christian denominations, has been experiencing a severe shortage of clergy. Unfortunately, my order, the Paulist Fathers, is also not immune to these demographic shifts. As a result, the Paulists are currently engaged in a process of discernment and planning to address our own aging personnel pool and diminishing membership.

Just before the winter break, I received a communication from the President of the Paulists, Fr. Rene Constanza, who informed me that the Paulists intend to reassign me this coming summer. This means that I will be leaving my position as chaplain at Rensselaer and Christ Sun of Justice. According to the agreement between the Paulists and the Rensselaer Newman Foundation, which funds and supports the chaplaincy, the agreement can be terminated with six months' notice, and they have now given that notice.

During the remaining six months of my time here, I will be working closely with the board of the Rensselaer Newman Foundation, the RPI administration, and our parish leadership to find a suitable replacement chaplain who can build upon the work we have done together. In my preliminary conversation with the leadership of the Albany diocese, they have expressed a desire for dialogue to explore how the pastoral needs of our parish can be met.

At this point there are many questions yet to be answered, and contingencies to be planned for. In some ways this six month period is a gift: often these changes in leadership and assignments happen with very little notice. We have the opportunity to work together to keep our parish community growing and moving forward.

I know this is difficult news for all of us. I hope I can count on your prayers and support as we process this new development. May the Holy Spirit continue to guide our community.
