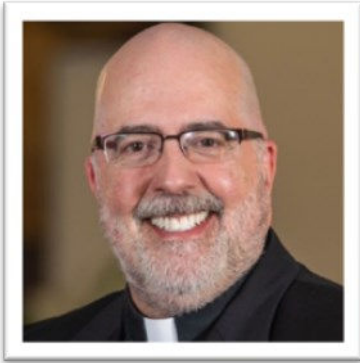

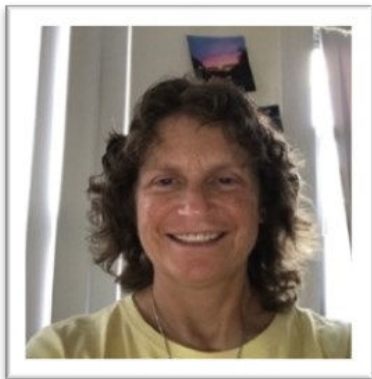

Did you know that the Capital Region is home to an **Ignatian Volunteer Corps** chapter?

Steeped in *contemplatives in action* spirituality of St. Ignatius, the Ignatian Volunteer Corps "provides opportunities for men and women age 50 or better to touch the lives of people who are poor and disadvantaged, offering hope and affirming human dignity."

In addition to serving within a *partner community organization* such as Unity House (Troy) and Samaritan Hospital, Ignatian Volunteers *meet monthly with a trained spiritual reflector* to reflect on the meaning of their service. Importantly, all Ignatian Volunteers in the community gather together monthly to share their experiences, **seeking God's surprises** along the way.
