Some of Jesus' most powerful parables are uniquely recorded in Luke: The Good Samaritan, The Rich Fool, The Prodigal Son, The Rich Man and Lazarus, The Persistent Widow, and The Pharisee and the Tax Collector. 
### WORLWIDE MARRIAGE ENCOUNTER
