Essential Question #1: What caught your attention or grabbed your heart during liturgy today/this week?

M: During Mass this weekend, I noticed a theme of God's loving persistence across all of our readings. I have been reminded of how those who are diligent in good deeds and petitioning to God are always under His care.

- J: My heart beating rapidly this whole week due to my prayer participation and then God's answers coming to me.
- T: Out of town and attending liturgy elsewhere, it was the bloody knees of the Jesus above the alter that grabbed me, and stayed with me as Pope Francis and the Church make our penitential pilgrimage with Indigenous peoples

<u>Essential Question #2</u>: How does it feel God is calling you to respond? How will you incorporate this into your life beyond Mass?

- M: I feel that God is calling me to reach out to Him during more situations of my life and to trust Him. Even when I don't believe it, He wants to hear from me.
- J: God wants to constantly lead me thru my questionable times. He wants me to listen and trust his direction. This is a daily walk for both of us, not just on Sundays.
- T: I have been leaning in to listen how I might incorporate the work of reconciliation as a result of our checkered history into the fabric of my social studies classes.
