ORDINARY TIME – THE MEANING: After our full participation in the forty days of Lent, the Triduum, and the fifty days of Easter, we now return to counting or numbering the weeks, not the days, of the liturgical year. Ordinary Time, which will take us through the summer and fall, comprises the thirty or so weeks that are not marked by major feasts. The longest stretch of Ordinary Time begins after

Evening Prayer on the Solemnity of Pentecost and continues up to the start of the new liturgical year on the First Sunday of Advent. The seasons of the Church reflect the rhythms of our lives, with peak moments and times of quiet growth. The liturgical color of Ordinary Time, green, reminds us that this is still a season of growth in our discipleship, a time to continue maturing into the followers of Jesus Christ we are meant to be.


The collection basket will be available by the doors into

### A Message from Deacon Joe:

Tracey and I are forever grateful for being part of the faith community of Christ Sun of Justice for the past seven years and for the many friendships and family relationships that eternally connect us. I am humbled to serve you as a servant of servants - your deacon. We have been very blessed to have gotten to know you and your families and will always cherish the memories of our time together.

During the course of this pilgrim journey, we have witnessed numerous testimonials to our faith and many changes, many of which have been difficult and incomprehensible, many in the long run to better serve you, the holy people of God. We have been through the good times and bad. Hope and trust in God have been our beacons.

And then there was the pandemic! Fortunately for social media, e-mail and phones we were able to remain connected as one body, the Body of Christ. One of the gifts that we appreciated is closer family ties, having to all work from home and be quarantined together.

In the midst of the NY PAUSE begun in mid-March, we sold our home in Colonie within five days of actively listing it. Through boots on the ground - a realtor and our in-laws - we found a newly constructed home in a gated community in Port Charlotte, FL. Who would have thought one could buy a house through virtual media and the internet? We also retired from our respective employer's - me on 4/30 and Tracey on 5/15. Meag continues to work from home here for the same NY company.

Having signed our NY closing documents beforehand due to social distancing protocols, we began our new journey toward the sunshine state on our daughter Meaghan's birthday (5/19) - three cats, Tracey and Meag in one car, and the dog and me in another.

We stopped just short of midpoint of our trek in Rocky Mount, NC at around 4:30 am, having left NY around 6pm the night before after a long day of work and final packing. We stayed in NC at a pet-friendly hotel, getting about 6 hours or so of sleep. On the road again we arrived in Port Charlotte on 5/20. Again, we were in a pet-friendly hotel in Port Charlotte not far from our home.

On 5/22, we closed here in FL and since have been furnishing, unpacking, organizing and continuing to declutter (donations benefitting Goodwill).

We are currently church "shopping." We attended Mass at different times at Sacred Heart in Punta Gorda, about 10 minutes away. Last November, we visited San Antonio parish, also less than 10 minutes away. We plan future trips there as well as a church Mary Nagy recommended - St. Maximillian Kobe - about 20 minutes from our house. I plan on a several month sabbatical before deciding on ministry and becoming a minister here in the Diocese of Venice.

Tracey, Meag and I would love to hear from you. A good-bye letter seems inappropriate but it's the best we could do under the current circumstances. However, we will be in NY in August for my niece's wedding. I plan to serve at a final Mass at CSJ at 11am on Sunday 8/23. Respecting safe gathering requirements, I hope to be able to see you then in person. Until then, I leave you with a song, one of many, that embodies my experience at CSJ. It's a familiar one: Where Charity and Love Prevail. (Hymn: *Ubi Caritas*, tr. Omer Westendorf (1961). Tune: CHRISTIAN LOVE, CM, by Paul Benoit (1961)).

Where charity and love prevail, there God is ever found; Brought here together by Christ's love, by love are we thus bound. With grateful joy and holy fear His charity we learn; Let us with heart and mind and soul now love him in return. Forgive we now each other's faults as we our faults confess; And let us love each other well in Christian holiness. Let strife among us be unknown, let all contention cease; Be His the glory that we seek, be ours His holy peace. Let us recall that in our midst dwells God's begotten Son; As members of His body joined, we are in Him made one. No race or creed can love exclude, if honored be God's name; Our family embraces all whose Father [Mother] is the same.
