

LETTER FROM BISHOP SCHARFENBERGER "A RETURN TO MASS"

Given the most recent changes in regulations and after considerable consultation; from the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Sunday, June 6th 2021) I will remove the *general* dispensation from the obligation to go to Mass on Sundays and Holy Days given back in March 2020. However, there would still be a *particular* dispensation from this obligation for those in certain circumstances; such as, those who are sick or who are at risk, or who care for those who are sick or at risk, or those who experience significant anxiety or fear of getting sick from being in a public setting. Did you know that we are in the midst of "Laudato Si Week"?

May 16-25, 2021 has been set aside by the Church to commemorate Pope Francis' encyclical. It is also a time to reread *Laudato Si*, linked below, praying for **Holy Spirit** to come and renew our hearts in such a way that we are impelled to make changes for the Care of our Common Home and Dear Neighbor.

Excerpts from *Laudato Si* to pray with this week:

[T]he ecological crisis is also a summons to profound interior conversion...Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience. (#217)

[Great importance of the family,] political institutions and various social groups are also entrusted with helping to raise people's awareness. So too is the Church. All Christian communities have an important role to play in ecological education. (#214)

We have to realize that a true ecological approach always becomes a social approach; it must integrate questions of justice in debates on the environment, so as to hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor. (#49)
