As I'm writing this, I'm in San Antonio, Texas, for the annual conference of the Catholic Campus Ministry Association. It's been a good meeting so far, with engaging speakers, challenging workshops, and a chance to re-connect with old friends who share the same ministries. I'm also only 80 miles from Uvalde, a rural town west of San Antonio, where this week an 18-year-old murdered 21

people, for reasons that aren't yet clear. The horror and sorrow here are palpable. Those of us gathered for the CCMA conference have been talking about this terrible crime— "tragedy" seems like an inadequate word— and wondering how we got to this place. And wondering what we do next. I don't claim to have any particular political expertise or wisdom to offer, but I am baffled that our nation chooses to live this way. I can't accept the notion that nothing can be done, that we cannot protect our children, and that firearms are some special class of device that can't be regulated. We've all heard people immediately move to blame mental illness for the more than 300 mass shootings in the US so far this year. Oddly, the people who want to blame mental illness are often the same ones who resist providing adequate funding for research and treatment of mental illness. The truth is you don't have to be mentally ill to pick up a gun and start shooting. All you have to be is angry. And you have to have access to a gun. "Thoughts and prayers" have become a tired trope for helplessness. Still, as people of faith prayer is always our refuge. I'm praying that prayers will be followed by thoughts leading to action. God help us. Please.
