ABOUT THE FEAST OF THE NATIVITY OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, 8 SEPTEMBER: Exactly 9 months after the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary (8 December), we come to a feast in honor of Mary's birth. This is one of only three "birthdays" on the liturgical calendar, the other two being the birthdays of Jesus and of John the Baptist (other days recognize a saint's "day of death"). We recall the greatness of Mary and her importance in all of salvation history, as we remember her humble and obedient "Yes" to give birth to Jesus the Christ, the Savior of the World. So on this day we honor the life of this young woman, Mary Immaculate, called to be the Mother of God and our mother, queen of heaven and earth.
