Rosh Hashanah Our Spiritual Ancestors in Judaism are celebrating the beginning of the "Days of Awe" this Sunday Evening, September 29, with the High Holy Day of Rosh Hashanah. It literally means the head of the year, a new year, a new beginning in the life gifted by God. It comes at the time of harvest, and is marked by the blowing of the shofar, a ram's horn, raising a great noise of praise to the God of life. May we join our Jewish brothers and sisters in reflecting on what we have sown in our lives, which can now be

Next GIFT is <u>27 October 2019</u>. This session topic is *Faithful Citizenship*. The speaker will be Barbara DiTommaso, retired director of the diocesan Commission on Peace and Justice. Born and raised in Endicott, Broome County, DiTommaso moved to Troy after high school to join the Sisters of St. Joseph. She obtained a bachelor's degree in secondary mathematics with a minor in theology from The College of Saint Rose and a master's in theology from La Salle University in Philadelphia. Prior to becoming a social activist, she taught math, physics and theology for 10 years in Capital Region Catholic schools and was for six years a religious education director in the Diocese of Syracuse. What kept coming up while teaching was the home and family circumstances the children were coming from. There was so much flux going on in society with the Vietnam War and civil rights, and Barbara came to realize that she needed to work on social change full time. The Second Vatican Council gave her impetus, and she wanted to do something more directly tied to people's lives. Come learn more and dialogue about the Catholic faith as we explore various topics in *Catholicism 101*, this year's theme. All are welcome! Thank you for all who attended the first session, and to Annette Brooks, MA, our speaker, who informed us about the written records associated with our Catholic Tradition, handed down by the Apostles and early church.
